UMW Reading Program Update

There have been major changes in the Reading Program. In 2018, the UMW Library stopped lending books and in January 2019 the United Methodist Women Mission Resources no longer stocks the reading program books. There are other places that books can be found. Andris Salter, from National Program Resources, says that:

"You will be able to purchase books from Cokesbury, Amazon and other major retailers, often at a lower cost than offered by Mission Resources.

Purchases from Amazon are shipped free if you are a Prime member. If you purchase through the Amazon Smile program, a donation is made with each order to United Methodist Women. To learn more about Amazon Smile, <u>visit www.smile.amazon.com.</u> (Choose the United Methodist Women in New York, NY, to support the national office.)"

Check your local library as some libraries carry the Reading Program books, or they may be available through the library's lending program.

There are four Reading Program plans. Each plan requires reading at least one book (or more depending on the plan) from each of the following categories; Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth, along with regular reading of Response magazine.






