

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Facebook – Adding Pictures

It's relatively easy to add pictures on Facebook if you have a digital camera. You start by clicking on the tab at the top called Photos. Next go to create an album. It will ask you to give the album a name, location and description. Most important is the security. You can make it available to Facebook friends, everyone (not recommended), friends of friends, or customize. If you choose customize you can list specific people it will be visible to and specific people who you hide it from. Always remember to save settings. Now you are ready to add pictures to your album. It is easiest if you already have uploaded pictures to your PC. You simply go to add pictures and select those you want to upload. Once they upload you can edit photos, add more, organize (you can drag pictures to a different spot in your album or click reverse order at the top), edit info (captions), delete pictures. After you make any changes, don't forget to save changes at the bottom. Remember any thing you write under pictures (yours and others) is visible to anyone that has accessibility to the album, this is not just between you and the person you are commenting on. You can leave a comment on individual pictures or the album as a whole.

Tagging pictures: Other people can tag pictures to you and you can tag them as well. You go to the bottom right side of the picture you want to tag and click on tag this photo, then click on the face of the person you are tagging and a box of all your contacts comes up. You choose the person and it will be sent to their Facebook wall.

If you don't want everyone to see pictures tagged of you, go to Account (upper right side of home page,) then photos and videos I'm tagged in. Make this custom and then add names to make this visible to or add names to hide this from. I make most pictures I'm tagged in visible to my immediate family only. That is mostly who sends them to me as well.
