From Your District Superintendent

Last week I found myself in the midst of a gathering of Extended Cabinets, BOOM reps, Bishops, and other conference leaders from the South Central Jurisdiction. We met at a gathering called "Bishops' Week." The focus of the meeting was "Excellence in Ministry: Developing Fruitful Leaders." This is an issue that has been a part of Methodism beginning with Mr. Wesley himself.

Wesley asked this question regarding his preachers: "Have they fruit?" He also made the issue of fruitfulness a matter to be considered by the lay folks who were participants in the Class meetings established by Wesley in his day. Thus, the question bears on each of us who walk in the way of Christ.

The Rev. Nathan E. Kirkpatrick is managing director at Leadership Education at Duke Divinity and an ordained elder in the Western North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. In an article about Wesley's question, Rev. Kirkpatrick had this to say:

"Have they fruit?" John Wesley asked of his would-be preachers. Could those who were seeking ordination show anything for their service? Was there at least one person who had found faith through the word they proclaimed? A single person whose spiritual practices had been enlivened by what they taught? A hungry person who found bread? A homeless person who found shelter? Was there any sign that the ministry exercised by this person was waking the world to the dream of God?

Again, the evidence from Wesley does not limit this question to pastors, but presents it to all of those who claim to be disciples of Christ.

Fruit is that which carries the seed of the plant which produced it. So, the fruit that we bear carries the seed of God's love which is planted in the heart of the other. We are carriers of Christ's love and grace and have the obligation and opportunity to infect others with the reality of God's transformative presence.

To bear fruit we need to cultivate God within us. This happens through spiritual discipline and the exercise of spiritual gifts. We need to continually pray, study, serve, proclaim, give, worship, fellowship, and love. This will ensure that the fruit that we carry will be full and loaded with the essence of God.

One other observation. The inquiry regarding fruit needs to begin within each of us. Before we can ask "Have they fruit?," we must ask "Have I fruit?" So today I am considering this question within my own heart. Each day this is where it begins – am I "... waking the world to the dream of God?"

Pension Meetings Being Held in July

The Kansas East Conference will be hosting meetings throughout the Conference to explain the changes in the clergy pension plan and cover the changes in the retirees health plan. These changes will be effective January 1, 2014.

All active clergy (not in retirement status) are encouraged to attend to learn how the pension plan has changed. The new pension plan will require a contribution into your UMPIP (clergy match) and you will learn what affect it will have should you make the decision not to contribute the required match.

Those serving a quarter-time will receive a contribution to their pension, only it will not go into the CRSP as it currently does.

The pension portion of the day will be from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. In the afternoon from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., that portion will cover Extend Health which will be the new coverage for the retirees at the first of the year.

There will be a representative from the General Board to assist with these meetings.
