Nestled in a small town consisting mainly of a gas station, café, bar and two churches is Blue Mound UMC. The church building was originally built in the late 1800's. This past year it received a new roof and a new upstairs kitchen and fellowship hall. These are the tangible changes happening in this small congregation, part of the "fruit" so to speak. They have increased attendance by 40% and are more visible to the community as well. This is no small accomplishment in a town boasting 285 in 2008, with a growth of 2.8% since then.

The Little Church That Could... "ABIDE"

Blue Mound UMC is led by Pastor Dallas Peterson and is part of a charge with Mound City UMC. The churches' restoration both internal and external began in February of 2008. A small team of three couples began attending the ABIDE program for small church leadership initiative. The team consisted of Pastor Dallas and his wife Connie, Terry and Jackie Broyles, and Nathan and Krissy Beckmon. As Peterson says, "It was a small team, but mighty!"

The ABIDE program is based on "ABIDE" the single most important instruction Jesus gave his disciples related to their life mission.

"I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5)

By abiding they would: glorify the Father, bear much fruit, and prove to be His disciples. (John 15:8)

The ABIDE program began in December of 2004, when a group of fifteen leaders from five denominations met to prayerfully explore what the Holy Spirit might be doing to create a renewal movement for smaller congregations. This development team became the Small Church Leadership Initiative (SCLI). ABIDE is their initial offering.

ABIDE teams are formed to establish spiritual and strategic continuity for fruitfulness. Teams consist of the pastor and three to ten lay persons from each church. Usually ten to twelve congregations participate and embark together on a 12-15 month journey to discover in faith and joy how to:

Abide in Jesus and love one another,

Learn from the best teachers available,

Prayerfully discern the leading of the Holy Spirit for their congregation's future,

Trust each other to claim that future for God's glory and greater fruitfulness.

"The cost of the program is minimal," said Peterson. There is a \$250 program fee, transportation and motel costs. Bridges to the Future picked up the rest of the costs.

You cannot help but look at the small church membership at Blue Mound and realize that for members to roof the church, and build the new kitchen and fellowship hall, major sacrifices of both time and money were made.

The cost of the new roof was \$16,000, with almost half of the money raised by several members giving \$1,000 each and raising \$7,500, the balance being taken out of the general fund. A roofing company was contracted to complete the actual work on the steep and gabled roof.

Members completed the work on the kitchen and fellowship hall. They now have a bright upstairs space for church dinners and meetings that are also used by the community for reunions, etc.

Improvements to the parking area in front of the church were needed and completed. All these things make the church more visible and inviting to this small community. These changes are what attracted one woman, who has considered herself a United Methodist most of her life but had not been active for years. She actually thought Blue Mound UMC had been closed and now has been attending regularly for the past six months.

The church building is also being used for an after school program. Area children were bused from the Mound City grade school, which is 13 miles away. There is a program in place for the children from 4:00 to 5:00 PM. Parents or guardians provide transportation for their children's safe return to their homes. The after school program is a cooperative program with Federated Church, the other church in town which is right next door. This cooperative program has been good for the community and according to Peterson; both churches are active and increasing in members.
