There have been many things going on around the district of late. I would like to share some thoughts about a few of them.

We need to sadly acknowledge the tragic death of one of our district pastors. Rev. Beth Hodgson and her husband, Willis, were both killed in a one car accident on Plum Creek road near Osawatomie on Sunday, February 22. This accident happened not too far from the Plum Creek United Methodist Church where Beth had served as pastor for many years. Please pray for the family of Willis and Beth, including their daughter Jada Hodgson, Certified Lay Minister at Princeton UMC, as they move forward from this loss.

Other news includes the announcement by Bishop Scott Jones of the appointment of Rev. David Watson as the new Five Rivers District Superintendent beginning on July I, 2015. David is currently the Senior Pastor of Salina First UMC. He comes to this position with many years of effective service as a pastor. David has served in the 5R district in the past at Baldwin City First UMC and at Fort Scott First UMC. David also served as the DS of the Parsons District in the Kansas East Conference at one time. Please watch for information about a welcome event for David that will happen sometime in the summer.

Of course we need to be mindful of the appointment process that is ongoing in the Annual Conference. This time of year always brings a level of anxiety for United Methodist pastors and churches. There have been some appointment changes already announced in the Five Rivers District. There may be others. Please pray for the pastors and churches of the district as we navigate change and seek to build strong and faithful relationships between pastors and churches.

Lay Servant Ministry ~ Take another look at how this program might help support your local church and further develop discipleship.

Have you ever wondered what Lay Servant Ministries encompass? Lay Servant Ministries have something to help all laity grow in their faith walk and be better equipped for service in their local church and beyond. They offer four different paths of coursework. Classes are open to anyone and not dependent on their participation in the program. Lay servant Ministries have changed their format and with the Great Plains Conference, are able to offer more workshops than ever before.

Lay Servant Ministry was formerly called Lay Speaking Ministry. In the past it was geared more toward folks that wanted to fill the pulpit, either in their local church (Local Church Lay Speakers) or in their own church and beyond (Certified Lay Speakers).

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church approved the name change of Lay Speaking Ministries to Lay Servant Ministries in 2012.

There are now four pathways in this program. They are Local Church Lay Servant Ministry, Certified Lay Servant Ministry, Certified Lay Speaker Ministry and Certified Lay Ministers. Each one has specific criteria to follow and require several things to maintain status. You can find everything you need to learn about the options on the Great Plains website address below.

So what does this mean to you? You don't need to participate in the program to attend a Lay Servant Ministry workshop. We encourage you to take any and all courses that will help you develop your faith. There are more courses than ever being offered and many of them are within several hours of drive time to attend. There are also online courses offered.

We recommend using the folks that have gone through the program and have been approved by their local church through church conference action. They are listed with contact information on our website on the Lay Servant Ministries page.

Anyone that is listed as a Certified Lay Servant (CLS) may fill the pulpit locally or outside their church. A DSA is already serving a local church as a District Superintendent Assignment.
