Reflections from Ron

Friends and colleagues,

November is upon us. This is typically the season when we start thinking about the close of the year. Thanksgiving, being just around the corner, will sound the trumpet to signal the beginning of the holiday season. At a time in our year when we are usually growing anxious about everything the end of the year means, many people find themselves increasingly anxious because they are at the end of their means. The nation, our nation, which has long waved the flag of pride that we are the wealthiest nation on earth now find ourselves watching our wealth disappear right before our very eyes. These are difficult times, not just for us, but for the entire world. Some people at their wits end are wondering what to do. Romans 5:1-5

¹ Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.

³ And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Maybe, just maybe it is in these very troubling times for the entire world that we have an opportunity to stand as a beacon of hope for those who don't know our Christ and shout to the world that these are troubling times. These are character building times. These are the times that produce hope and not despair because we depend on God who is still in control. Perhaps — this is a time when we can be cultivating Christian growth among ourselves while sowing seeds of hope for the rest of the world community.
