

Fab Five Fall Festival and Fellowship Event ~ Oct. 30th by Marvé Ralston

What brought over 300 United Methodist laity and clergy to Ottawa 1st on Saturday? The answer is the Fab Five Fall Festival and Fellowship event. The goal was to have a radical worship service, outstanding and motivating speaker, sharing of what is working/ministry in our local churches and a great day of fellowship. Although there is always room for improvement, the weather cooperated and the day was a flurry of fun activities.

Worship began with Rev. January Kiefer (LaCygne/New Lancaster) leading the group with the theme of Living Water. She had artfully decorated the Chancel area with fabric that represented and very realistically left one with the impression of flowing water. She enthusiastically set the tone and mood for meditative worship. Rev. Mitch Todd led us in the singing of hymns. The sound of over 300 United Methodist's joining in song was sweet indeed.

Bishop Robert Schnase who has written Five Practices of Fruitful Living and Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations was our guest speaker. He presented questions to ponder on how services, and ministries are currently being done. What is working and why or why not? He gave an example of what had and had not worked with a group he led. They found that the best time to rally a group of college age students was 9 p.m., in someone's home, on a Sunday night with pizza. For most of us that would probably not be our first choice but it worked and grew the group considerably.

Schnase encouraged the study of the unchurched to figure out what would attract them to join us. It began with making it easy for them to attend, not hard. He went on to talk about building personal relationships and not forgetting that it is in the margins that we come into contact with the unchurched. We should use every opportunity to draw and invite others into relationship with God.

We broke for lunch and one group went to the gym for our Festival of Ministry sharing event while the other ate lunch. Local churches were asked to bring posters, pictures, mission trip mementos, and whatever best describes their churches concentration of ministries. Many hours were spent on this and most of our churches were well represented with wonderful ideas to share about what was working for them. There were children's ministries, green ministries, movie night ministry, insightful ways to raise funds for your ministry among just a few ideas. It was hard to take it all in but the excitement was definitely in the air as members of each church shared with one another. The Boogers a local Blue Grass group played soft background music for a true treat for the ears during the festival of sharing time and before worship.

In the afternoon we heard more from Bishop Schnase and many folk went home with notes on how they were going to make changes effective as soon as possible. Cokesbury had several tables set up for those who wanted to purchase books and there are more tools including a bible study guide and DVD set to go along with the books.
