Incoming Treasurer

Let me introduce myself as your new District Treasurer. My name is Donna Grigsby. My husband, Stan and I live in Iola. I have a BA in Finance and I am the treasurer of the National Grigsby Family Society, a 300-member organization. I have been the District E&I Coordinator for the past four years.

The first thing I would like to say is that each unit should have at least two persons who have signature authority on the checking account. This is usually the treasurer and the president. You may also want to add another person such as the secretary. This means that someone is available to sign a check in the absence of the treasurer.

By the time, you receive this newsletter, you should have received the new Remittance Forms. The main change to the form is the removal of pennies as they are no longer being listed separately. Your unit is encouraged to increase your pledge to mission by the amount you would give for pennies.

The Conference is also encouraging each unit to strive for either 5-Star or 7-Star giving. This is a great way to support the UMW Mission work.

The GP Conference has designated a rotating schedule for giving to National Mission Institutions (NMI). For 2018, the NMI designated for receiving Five Rivers District offerings is **The Big Garden** in Omaha, NE. This is not set in stone so if your unit prefers to give to one of the other NMIs, you may still do that.

When submitting your checks to the District Treasurer, please write them to "Five Rivers District UMW". They can also be written to "UMW, Great Plains Conference".






